


# Federal grant money that goes to state/local government

Federal Outlays to State and Local Governments, FY 2011 (\$ in Billions, % of Total)






## The "fix" didn't change much

- Two-month delay until March 1, 2013
- The sequester changes minimally:
  - \$85 billion (from \$109 billion) split equally between defense/nondefense
  - Many exemptions, special rules remain
- Domestic discretionary <-5.9% (FFIS estimate) instead of -8.2% (OMB estimate)</li>
- Domestic mandatory <-5.7% (FFIS) instead of -7.6% (OMB)




# While most state grant programs are subject to sequester...

Health	3%

# Potential impact of amended sequester is relatively minor
